Fact file: Irish New Year Traditions

Families in Ireland usually clean their houses from top to bottom to meet the New Year in cleanliness.

At midnight, people in Ireland often bang the walls of their houses with loaves of bread. They believe that this should bring a lot of bread over the coming year.

Irish people leave a place at the dinner table for dead family members to make them welcome.

It is important for the Irish who enters the house first at the start of the New Year. It is believed that a handsome man with dark hair is better than a woman with red hair.

There is a tradition to open the back door just before midnight to let the old year out and then open the front door to let the new year in.
